#### THANK YOU FOR CHRISTIAN AID

Thank you very much to all who gave so generously to Christian Aid on 7 April. Altogether we collected the magnificent sum of £472.55. If the £26 raised by gift aid is added to this, it amounts to almost £500. Many more opportunities to help in May – see above!

Christian Aid aims to bring an end to poverty. Working with partners in 37 countries, it brings practical relief to refugees in the Ukraine, in Turkey and Syria following the earthquake there and now runs a community kitchen in North Gaza. It also works to help people learn how to adapt to threats such as those posed by climate change, choosing drought-resistant crops and forming cooperatives to market their produce. In the forthcoming Christian Aid Week, 12-18 May, the focus will be on Alina, who lives in Burundi and was rescued from a life on the streets and helped to form a Village Savings and Loans Association. She was able to buy a goat, a bicycle and a solar panel and run a successful business.

#### **NOTES ON A GREEN THEME**

This year, <u>Earth Day</u>'s theme is "Planet vs. Plastics"  $\Im \bigcirc$ . It underscores the urgent need to combat plastic pollution and unite for the sake of human and planetary health.

Do you know that 12 million tonnes of plastic finds its way into the ocean every single year? 9.5 million tonnes of this enters the ocean from the land with 1.75 tonnes being chucked into the sea directly from the fishing and shipping industry. There are approximately 51 trillion microscopic pieces of plastic, weighing 269,000 tons floating about in the oceans.

These figures were published by the organisation Surfers Against Sewage. It is right that we are made aware of statistics like this and that we are encouraged to try and limit our use of single use plastic but there is lots going on in the world to take heart from.

There are many products are being made using recycled plastic and the technology to do so is developing all the time. Caroline Taylerson has recently told me about two innovative companies that are making carpets, rugs and other soft furnishings from recycled materials. Weaver Green a company based in Devon that has developed a process to turn plastic bottles into yarn soft enough to make home soft furnishings. Another company doing a similar thin is Unnatural Flooring, both worth checking out.

Other companies like Green Toys making childrens toys and their packaging out of recycled materials and who says that, to them,' every day is Earth Day'.

There are many companies now making outdoor furniture for individual households and public places out of recycled plastic.

Clothing companies like, for example, Patagonia make clothes out of recycled polyester fabricthat is made from post-consumer plastic bottles and other recycled materials. It creates a wide range of products including jackets, fleeces, and t-shirts. Patagonia also has a program called Worn Wear, which encourages customers to repair and recycle their old Patagonia clothing rather than throw it away.

Shoes made from recycled plastic bottles are another product now increasingly becoming a more popular and environmentally-friendly alternative to traditional footwear. Rather than using new materials, companies are finding innovative ways to repurpose waste plastic into new products, including shoes. This process not only helps to reduce plastic waste in the environment but also reduces the carbon footprint of producing new materials. Adidas is just one of the high end names going down this route.
