NOTES ON A GREEN THEME

Recently we were thinking about food recycling. This week we are looking at the recycling of soft plastics.

Here is a list issued by Richmond Upon Thames that clearly identifies the soft plastics you can take to any of the local soft plastic recycling location points.

- All plastic bags, except biodegradable or compostable bags
- Bread bags
- · Breakfast cereal liners
- Delivery bags
- Dry cleaning bags
- Frozen food bags
- Magazine and newspaper wrappers
- Multi-pack wrapping
- Plastic marked as low-density polyethylene (LDPE) resin ID code 4
- Toilet roll wrapping
- Fruit and Vegetable Nets
- Coffee Pouches

Selected stores of major supermarkets also accept:

- Baby, pet food, detergent and cleaning pouches
- Biscuits and chocolate wrapping
- Cheese, fish and meat wrapping
- Cling film
- Crisp and sweet bags
- Plastic film lids
- Bubble wrap
- Salad, pasta, and rice bags

Top tips for recycling plastic bags & films

- All items should be clean and free of food.
- Tear off sticky labels where possible.
- Compostable and biodegradable bags are not designed to be recycled and if they
 enter the recycling system can potentially cause quality issues in the recycled
 material. These should be placed in your home composting bin, if you have one.

So where can you take your soft plastic collections?

Most of the large supermarkets have soft plastic recycling facilities including; Tesco's, Sainsburys, M&S, Co-op, Waitrose, Aldi, Asda and Morrisons

Don't forget that you can bring your used batteries, ink cartridges, blister packs and spectacles into the recycling area at church. The recycling baskets have moved to on top of the cupboard through the door on the right hand side of the entrance, under the North Tower.

KNITTING GROUP – FRIENDS OF FAITH

Our inter faith knitting group meets monthly. New members from all faiths always welcome. We knit items such as blankets, baby clothes with hats and mittens. Hats and scarves etc for adults. These are distributed by the Methodist Church in Sunbury to refugee and other families in need in Hounslow and Richmond boroughs. We also knit for the homeless and Prosperity Ukrainian Cafe which takes all items to Ukraine.
