#### **NOTES ON A GREEN THEME**

What are 'Warm Hubs' and where can you find them in our part of Richmond Borough? Gov UK say that 'Warm Hubs are intended as places in local communities where people can find a safe, accessible and warm environment during the day to help reduce the cost of heating their own homes and to help those facing extreme fuel poverty through the winter months'.

There are many such warm hubs locally:

**Twickenham Library** - open to all between 9.30 – 6.00 Tues, Thurs and Fri. 9.30 – 7.00 Mon & Weds, 9.30 – 4.00 Sat Closed on Sunday

**The Turks Head** 28 Winchester Road. Free voluntary and community sector space. Open to all Mon – Sat 12 noon -11 pm and Sunday 12 noon to 9pm

The Real Junk Food Project ETNA Rosslyn Road. Open to all Mon, Wed and Fri 11.30 to 1.30pm


**St Stephens Church**. Free voluntary and community sector space. Open to all on Mondays (including bank holidays) 10.00 am to 12 noon and Thursdays 6.30 – 9pm

St Stephens Church – drop in. Open to adults on Thursdays from 6.30 to 9pm

ETNA Community Centre. Free and Community Centre Open to all Mondays to Fridays 3.30 – 5.30

**Age UK.** Twickenham Day Centre Open to older residents. Tuesday 10am-2pm and Wednesday 9-11pm And possibly the smallest one I've seen locally is **Meet and Deep Newsagents** on the Hampton Road who offer a friendly and welcoming space for a chat and a bit of warmth.

## **KNITTING GROUP - FRIENDS OF FAITH**

We are a multi-faith, ecumenical local group - in 2024, we shall meet from 10.30-12.30 on the third Saturday of each month in St Mary's church hall - so our next meeting will be on 17 February.

Last year, by using the wool that was so kindly donated to us, we were able to give our knitted items - baby blankets, jackets, hats and mittens - to 'Baby Basics' in Sunbury and to 'The Extra Mile' at Hampton Mission Partnership. We also made hats, scarves, gloves and children's and adult jumpers that were sent to Ukraine, and shawls and wool hats for the elderly which were then given to 'The Extra Mile'.

This year we hope to include making hats, scarves and gloves for the local homeless if possible.

If you have some balls of wool that you can donate, we can turn them into items that are urgently needed, locally and internationally! Please either:
